| Background | <p>Wildlife Wonders offers a glimpse into an Otways ecosystem before the arrival of predators such as foxes and cats, where native wildlife lives freely in a flourishing bushland environment.</p> <p>This eco experience showcases the beautiful ecosystems and inhabitants of the Otway Ranges set against a stunning ocean backdrop. | Walk with Wildlife – guided tour | | | |
| The experience | <p>Students will experience an educational guided tour through the sanctuary where they will learn about a variety of ecosystems found in the magical Otways and the interactions which exist in nature. The knowledgeable conservationist guide will share the secrets of the bush and the plants, fungi and animals who call the Otways home. With prior negotiation, the experience can specifically cater to a general curriculum focus required by the school.</p> <p>The tour includes a pause at the Research Base to learn more about conservation and research projects currently being undertaken across the Otways by the Conservation Ecology Centre. Students will also observe some of the research work 'in action', including camera traps and nesting boxes, and learn about equipment ecologists use to conduct research.</p> | | |

| What to bring | The Wildlife Wonders experience is a 1.4km guided tour along a gently sloping and meandering path. We recommend wearing comfortable, enclosed walking shoes and checking the weather forecast before you visit. In summer, it may be quite hot, so we recommend you bring sunscreen and wear a hat. In winter, it may be cold, windy and rainy, so we recommend a warm jacket. It can rain at any time of the year in the Otways, so it's best to be prepared with a rainproof jacket. |
| Wet weather | Our tours run in almost all weather conditions and the bush is beautiful in the rain. However, we do reserve the right to delay or reschedule your tour if extreme weather threatens your safety. |
| Accessibility | The Walk with Wildlife tour is 1.4km long and takes just over an hour. The path is formed with a gentle gradient which can be managed by wheelchairs. Please contact our friendly Visitor Experience Officers on 1300 099 467 at least 48 hours prior to your tour time should you require assistance, so that we can support you to have the most wonderful experience. |
| Parking | There is ample parking for visitors at Wildlife Wonders. We are able to easily accommodate minibuses and coaches. |
| Animal list | <p>There are no cages at Wildlife Wonders – all animals are free to roam as they would in a bushland environment. Hence, we cannot guarantee wildlife sightings, however the following animals are onsite and it is quite rare that groups do not see koalas and more:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Eastern grey kangaroos ● Swamp wallabies ● Red-shouldered wallabies ● Red-bellied pademelons ● Southern brown bandicoots ● Long-nosed potoroos ● Eastern bettongs ● Emus <p>Aerial and arboreal wildlife including koalas, birds, possums and gliders come and go from the site at will. Without the predation threat from foxes and cats there is incredible levels of bird nesting activity through the spring and we only expect this to increase as the planting becomes increasingly established.</p> <p>There is also an army of frogs inhabiting the wetlands.</p> |
